Description of and Instructions for praying a Novena 20-28 September 2024

A *novena*, meaning nine, is an ancient style of prayer that is carried out consistently over a nine-day period for a particular intention and is usually directed to the intercession of a Divine Person of the Blessed Trinity, Our Lady, an Angel or a specific Saint. The nine days, or *novena*, has its Scriptural origin in the number of days in between Jesus' Ascension and Pentecost, during which the Blessed Mother and the Apostles were together in constant prayer until the descent of the Holy Spirit (see Acts 1: 6-14).

Praying a novena may be a new experience for some and a familiar spiritual exercise for others. There is a spirituality to praying any novena that is worth noting. The word "novena" comes from the Latin "novem" meaning "nine," recalling the number of days The Blessed Mother and the Apostles waited and prayed from the Ascension of Our Lord to the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. In the Acts of the Apostles, we read that Mary and the Apostles devoted themselves to constant prayer (Acts 1:12-14). Just as they prepared for the coming of the Holy Spirit, we emulate the same constancy in prayer looking forward to the coming feast of St. Michael.

To pray a novena, a few things should be kept in mind. First, we approach the Lord with faith, trust and in a humble, loving manner. Second, we choose a particular intention to be mentioned throughout the novena. Three, we decide to whom we address this prayer, the intercession of Our Lady or a Saint or Angel in particular. To determine the novena's starting date, count backwards nine days from the Saint's feast day; the last day of the novena is the day *before* the Saint's feast day. In the Archdiocese of Toronto, the Solemnity of Saint Michael the Archangel is celebrated on 29 September, the Feast of the Archangels, which means this novena begins on 20 September 2024.

The pattern of prayer is the same for each day: the opening prayer, which includes your specific intention, followed by one Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be, and ending with the Prayer to Saint Michael and a short litany. If you miss a day, just keep going: the main focus of any prayer is always about deepening our relationship with God and dwelling in his loving embrace.
