ABOUT THE **PANELISTS**

Sr. Nathalie Becquart, XMCJ serves as the Undersecretary of the General Secretariat of the Synod at the Vatican. As a Xavière sister from France, her mission has largely focused on youth and synodality. Prior to her current appointment in February 2021, she was National Director of the Service for the Evangelization of Young People and Vocations in France and did research in ecclesiology at the School of Theology and Ministry at Boston College.

Most Rev. J. Michael Miller, CSB (joining virtually) chief shepherd of Vancouver's 400,000 Catholics since 2009. Archbishop Miller taught theology for many years in Houston, Mexico and Rome, is an expert on the petrine office and modern papal teaching, and a popular speaker at conferences around the world. He was chosen by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops as one of its four delegates to the 2023-2024 "Synod on Synodality." Dr. Moira McQueen, LL. B M.Div. Ph.D. DSL (Hon.)

taught moral theology and bioethics at St. Michael's Faculty of Theology, University of Toronto, from 1994 until 2022, and is the Executive Director of the Canadian Catholic Bioethics Institute. She authored the award-winning book *Bioethics Matters* (republished in a third edition in 2023) and *Walking Together: A Primer on the New Synodality*, in 2022. She was the Canadian lay representative at the Second Synod on Marriage and the Family, 2015 and and was appointed by Pope Francis to serve on the International Theological Commission from 2014-2019.

Sr. Gill Goulding CJ is a Full Professor of Systematic Theology at Regis College at the University of Toronto and *professor Ordinarius* courtesy of the Dicastery for Education and Culture. Sr. Gill was appointed by Pope Benedict as a theological expert to the 2012 Synod on the New Evangelization and the Transmission of the Christian Faith. In 2021, she was appointed to the Theological Commission of the Secretariat of the Synod. She was involved in the work for the writing of the preparatory document, the Vademecum and the Document for the Continental Stage.
