Day One

ACTION

Today, bless your children and yourself with Holy Water.

Many Catholic moms have forgotten that they can receive divine assistance through the use of <u>sacramentals</u>. Blessing your children with Holy Water each morning and praying a little prayer ("I bless you in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit) over them will console both you and them.

Often, when you begin this practice, little children will want to bless you! Let them! Relish in the graces and forge a spiritual bond with your children like no other! Remind children that they each have their own Guardian Angel, and that their angel will help them, if they call on them and develop a relationship with their Guardian Angel. Pray this prayer and teach it to your children. Help them memorize it. Did you know that you can pray to your children's Guardian Angel, asking them to watch over your child? Teach them to pray a simple prayer each morning when they wake up!


PRAYERS

Today have a conversation with your children about friends, about choosing the right friends. Tell them that Jesus is actually their best friend, and that He has supernatural power to help them. Remind them that Jesus is always available to help them. Teach your children the song, <u>Jesus Loves Me</u>. Sing the song with them, several times over again, together until you both have joy in your hearts! Pray this prayer today!

Day Three

ACTION

Today consider formally entrusting your children to Our Blessed Mother. Have a conversation with Mary, the Mother of God, just as you would have a conversation with a dear friend. Tell her your fears, your concerns and ask her to take care of your children, in a way that you can't. Have a lively conversation with your children, asking them if they know that they have three mothers! You are their earthly mother, then they have a Godmother, but the most powerful mother.... and the mother that loves them the most, is Jesus' mother, Mother Mary, Mary, the Mother of God, Jesus' mother, is Queen of Heaven and Earth. Teach your children to pray the Hail Mary. Pray St. John Paul II with them.



Today, find a weekday Mass that you can attend with your family, praying for a happy and successful return to school. Explain to your children how Jesus is really truly present in the Eucharist. He is really there! Just like a good friend. He wants to see us more than once a week. Jesus is in our hearts and in the tabernacle. He is supernatural. Teach your children the ancient tradition of praying short powerful prayers (aka aspirations) that they can say throughout the day at school. Remind children that you will be praying for them. Ask them to pray for you. Today, throughout the day, pray these prayers with your children, to help them build the habit of praying short prayers in their hearts throughout the day!

"Jesus, I Trust in You!" (St. Faustina)

"Jesus, Help Me!"

"Mary, Mother of Jesus, please be a mother to me NOW." (St. Teresa of Calcutta)

"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." (Philippians 4:13)

"My dearest Guardian Angel, go before me, into this situation..."

"Guardian Angel, help me!"

"Come Holy Spirit, show me what to do, tell me what to say!"

Day Five

ACTION

Today consider getting a blessed Miraculous Medal, (or a blessed Crucifix or Sacred Heart Medal) and wearing it around your neck. Consider the same for your children. Many children receive a Crucifix or holy medal for their baptism or First Holy Communion, but never end up wearing it. Many miracles and signal graces are attributed to wearing a Miraculous Medal.

Take your children for a short visit to a Eucharistic Adoration Chapel. Ask them to sit and listen. Is Jesus speaking to their hearts? If you don't have an Adoration Chapel in your community, consider spending a few moment at an online Adoration Chapel.

"Whenever I go to the chapel, I put myself in the presence of our good Lord, and I say to him, Lord I am here. Tell me what you would have me to do. If he gives me some task, I am content and I thank him. If he gives me nothing, I still thank him since I do not deserve to receive anything more than that. And then, I tell God everything that is in my heart. I tell him about my pains and joys, and then I listen. If you listen, God will also speak to you, for with the good Lord, you have to both speak and listen. God always speaks to you when you approach him plainly and simply." St. Catherine of Laboure

Day Six

ACTION

Remind your kids that they are never alone. Throughout the day, they can call on the Holy Spirit in prayer! The Holy Spirit will help them! Remind children that they have friends in heaven (saints, deceased relatives and angels). Those friends want to help them and intercede for them, but we need to ask for their help! Consider watching a saints video. Tell your children to pray for their grandparents, family or friends who have died and gone to heaven. Many Catholics (including children) do not know that if we pray for Souls in Purgatory, they can help us here on earth. Children's prayers are powerful. Remind them of that. Consider looking up their patron saint and learning a little more about their own personal saint!

Day Seven

ACTION

On September 8th, the Catholic Church celebrates the birthday of Our Blessed Virgin Mary. Formally it is known as the <u>Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary</u> Make the Catholic faith fun for your children. Get a birthday cake for our Mother Mary. Serve it after dinner, with birthday candles and all. Sing a big warm Happy Birthday to Our Blessed Mother

On September 29, the Catholic Church celebrates the Feast of St. Michael the Archangel. Teach your children this powerful prayer. Offer a small reward for any children who memorize it.

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. Day Eight

ACTION

Teach your children to do the Sign of the Cross and to bless themselves, by praying, "In the Name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit." Tell them that there is tremendous power in that devotional act. Encourage them to bless themselves when they wake up in the morning and before they go to bed at night. The Sign of the Cross is a powerful prayer, a blessing, and a sacramental. It helps you to receive grace and helps you to cooperate with it. The Christian begins the day, prayers, and activities with the Sign of the Cross. Remind your children that just as they have learned to pray a Morning Prayer, (the Daily Offering in Day One) that they too need to remember their bedtime prayers. Consider suggesting your child makes a list of things they are grateful for.

Day Nine



ACTION
